The Strengthening International Research Capacity in Wales (**SIRCIW**) Fellowship Programme is a **postdoctoral fellowship** scheme part-funded by the **European Commission** under **Horizon 2020's** Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions cofund scheme.

The **programme** will support up to **90 fellows** to work at universities across **Wales**. The **scheme** is part of a strategy to **increase** research capacity in **Stemm subjects** (science, technology, engineering, mathematics and medicine). The programme is also open to **researchers** working in relevant areas of applied **social science**.



The **fellowships** provide a **3-year** fixed-term **postdoctoral** level appointment, and are **aimed** at researchers with typically **3-5 years** of **postdoctoral experience** who have **not** been **resident** in the **UK** for more than **12 months** in the last three years.

The **Welsh School of Architecture** (Professor **Wouter Poortinga**) and the School of **Psychology** (Professor **Wouter Poortinga** or Professor **Lorraine Whitmarsh**) are open to applications from high-calibre candidates in any eligible area, which could include **topics** such as 'people, energy and the built environment', 'risk, new technologies and the environment', and 'environmental behaviour'.

The next **deadline** for the SIRCIW/cofund fellowship programme is **04 october 2016**. It is important that you have **identified** a potential **supervisor**, and have their **support**
